Registering for OACIS makes it possible for anyone to access your thesis!


What is OACIS?

What are the merits of offering access to your academic dissertation via OACIS?

Anyone can access them over the Internet. The papers also show up on Google and other search engines. This increases the possibility that your academic paper—the product of your research—can be viewed and read by more people!

What do you need to do to provide access to your academic dissertation via OACIS?

1. Academic dissertation registration and consent form
 2. Your thesis in electronic format
- Complete 1 and submit it at a library counter
2. You can also send both 1 and 2 as email attachments.
- Please see the document entitled *Request related to recording master's theses and making them available via the OACIS academic repository* for details.

Please be sure to read the reverse side, too.
After you understand the FAQ, please provide your consent.

Frequently asked questions

Be sure to read this to keep your thesis secure.

Q1. What specifically does “making something available electronically” mean?

A1. It means posting academic dissertations online via OACIS, and making all of the following possible:

1. View the files online (via the Internet)
2. Print out the files that can be viewed
3. Save the files to PCs or flash memory devices

Please note any conditions you would like to apply related to making your files available electronically in the space provided for “other consent requirements” on the consent form.

Q2. What happens to the thesis copyright when theses are made available via OACIS ?

A2. The authors retain the copyright (management guideline number 9). This is true even when consent is given for the library to record, reproduce, release and store files using OACIS, or change media (management guideline number 5).

Q3. I plan to apply for a patent. Can I still register for OACIS?



Important!

A3. Yes. Please note, however, that you should complete your patent application before registering, because novelty is a requirement of a patent application. Anyone planning to file an application should carefully check the following points related to the consent form before submitting so they do not miss out on the opportunity to file the application.

1. Please check the appropriate box for the item pertaining to patent application plans, and write your planned application date.
2. Please write your desired timing in the space for the desired release date.
